<u>Please note that due to the holiday on Friday the data deadline has been pushed back to Wednesday November</u> 8th

November 8th is the last day to add NYSAA eligible students in Level 0 to pre-populate the KITE system for NYSAA testing. Students submitted to Level 0 after the deadline will need to be manually entered by the district in the KITE system.

Eligibility and Participation Criteria - NYSAA

- The CSE determines whether a student with a severe cognitive disability is eligible to take the NYSAA based on the following criteria:
 - The student has a severe cognitive disability and significant deficits in communication/language and significant deficits in adaptive behavior
 - The student requires a highly specialized educational program that facilitates the acquisition, application, and transfer of skills across natural environments (home, school, community, and/or 2 workplace)
 - The student requires educational support systems, such as assistive technology, personal care services, health/medical services, or behavioral intervention

Reporting NYSAA Students in Level 0

- Students eligible to take the New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA) must be reported as:
 - Ungraded: Elementary (13) for grades 3-6 or Secondary (14) for grades 7-12
 - Districts may use the 3 12 grade levels *for display purposes only* in their SMS
 - O Must have a Programs Fact Record: 0220 Eligible for Alternate Assessment
 - Must have a Program Service Code that indicates the Type of Disability (Pg. 242-243 SIRS)
 - The NYSAA Exam level given <u>must</u> match the <u>students age</u> as per the <u>NYSAA Level Birth Chart</u>
