- The purpose of this guide is to assist with submission, verification and certification of 2023-24 New York State Special Education reporting requirements that are NOT submitted through SIRS
- The only data that can be reported directly into the PD Data System are the PD 6 (Personnel Form) and PD 8 (Suspension Data).
- Data that populates these reports are populated and entered manually
- The State Education Department does not mail these forms. The forms may be printed at <a href="http://www.p12.nysed.gov/sedcar/data.htm#pdsys">http://www.p12.nysed.gov/sedcar/data.htm#pdsys</a>. The Word and PDF versions of the forms are best suited for printing. The data for these forms (PD-6 and PD-8) must be submitted electronically through the PD web-based data entry system at: <a href="http://pd.nysed.gov">http://pd.nysed.gov</a> or through the File Transfer Protocol (FTP) process. Paper copies of these reports are not accepted.

#### **PD System**

- The PD System is part of the NYSED Business Portal: http://portal.nysed.gov/portal/page/portal/PortalApp
- In order to access the PD system, users must have a State Education Department Delegated Account System (SEDDAS) username and password
- Superintendents and Charter School Leaders need to set up Delegated/Entitlement
  Administrator (DA/EA) accounts for Special Education Directors and staff in order for these
  staff members to access the PD system and submit data
- For the PD Data System, the entitlement is "PD System" and there are up to two specific level
  of access:
  - PD Contact: This delegation allows the user full access within the PD Data System. This user can see all data, drill down to student level data, enter data and certify reports within the system
  - <u>CIO</u>: This delegation allows read only access to all forms within the PD Data System. This user can view all data and drill down for student level data. They cannot enter data or certify reports

The PD6 form, Report of Personnel Employed or Contracted to Provide Special Education and Related Services to Students with Disabilities, must be completed by all school districts, including Special Act School Districts, Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), Charter Schools, selected State agencies, State-operated schools, State-supported schools, and approved private schools for preschool and school-age students with disabilities. This report is designed to collect full-time equivalent (FTE) data on or about October 6, 2021, regarding special education personnel who are employed or contracted to provide special education and related services to preschool and school-age students with disabilities. The New York State Education Department is required to report these data to the United States Department of Education (USDOE) pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) [P.L. 108-446, Section 618(a)(3)]. All schools must submit this report through our website at <a href="http://pd.nysed.gov">http://pd.nysed.gov</a>. Paper copies of this report will not be accepted.

The due date is February 1, 2022. Your timely and accurate completion of this report is required in order to ensure full compliance with federal reporting requirements.

#### Additional Instructions for Completing the PD8 Report

- 1. Report information for all students with disabilities (ages 3-21) who are the primary responsibility of your Committee of Preschool Special Education (CPSE) or Committee on Special Education (CSE) (or were enrolled in your Charter School), and who received in-school suspensions; or were suspended/expelled on an out-of-school basis; or were removed to an interim alternative education setting (IAES). Special Act School Districts and other approved private schools that provide educational services for students with disabilities pursuant to Article 81 should complete the PD8 report only for students with disabilities provided special education services pursuant to Article 81. Charter Schools should complete the PD8 report for all enrolled students with disabilities. Parentally placed students in non-public schools should not be included in any PD8 submission.
- 2. Data should be reported for the period July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Students whose suspension/expulsion begins within the reporting period but extends beyond the reporting period must be included in this report. Also, a student who commits an offense during this reporting period and is assigned a suspension/expulsion but receives the suspension/expulsion during the following reporting period must be included in this report.
- Records of the amount of time students with disabilities are suspended should be maintained for all half day suspensions but reported only if a student is suspended cumulatively for one or more days during the school year.
