Assessment Requirements And Accountability

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

- All students with disabilities must be included in the NYS assessment programs, with appropriate accommodations –alternate assessments for students with most significant cognitive disabilities as necessary and as indicated on individualized education programs (IEP).

Assessment Requirements

IEPs of alternately assessed students must include statement of why:

- why student cannot participate in regular assessment
- why the particular alternate assessment selected is appropriate

Staff must receive training and know how to:

- administer assessments, including alternate assessments
- make use of appropriate assessment accommodations

What is the NYSAA?



- NYSAA is part of the New York State testing program and measures the attainment of the State's learning standards for all students with the most severe disabilities
- Students are assessed in the following areas:
 - English Language arts (ELA): grades 3-8, and one time at the high school level
 - Mathematics: grades 3-8, and one time at the high school level
 - Science: grades 5 and 8, and one time the high school level

Computer Based Testing (CBT)

- NYSAA is only given CBT
- Districts are transitioning to all CBT for all subjects by 2026
- Even if the school is giving an assessment CBT, special ed students with an IEP that states they must take assessments on paper will be allowed PBT

Accountability Cap



- The total number of students assessed with an alternate assessment cannot exceed 1.0% of all tested students for each subject assessed-ELA, MATH and Science
- LEAs are not prohibited from assessing more than 1.0% must submit information justifying need to exceed the cap

What are the different user roles in the DLM computer-based KITE system?

There are several different user roles in the system. Each role has a set of capabilities in the system.

Role in Educator Portal	Description
Teacher	Has access only to the records for those students linked to their account by a roster. Can view student records and edit some information. Can view and edit First Contact Survey and the Access (PNP) Profile. This role is a good match for the test administrator, educator, or test examiner.
District Test Coordinator	A person at the district level who needs to be able to perform test coordinator functions. Can add roles and users in a district and the contained buildings. Can upload enrollment and roster files and modify student records. This role is a good match for district Data Stewards and Assessment Coordinators.
Building User	Can access records for all students in that building. Can view student records and edit some information.
Building Test Coordinator	A person in the building who needs to be able to perform test coordinator functions. Can assign roles to users and add users in an individual building. Can upload enrollment, roster, and TEC files.
Building Principal	Has access to users and students in an individual building with some upload and edit permissions.
District User	Has limited access to all students in the district with some view and edit permissions.
District Superintendent	Has view and edit permissions for users, students, and rosters in a district.

Assessments based on Birthdate

All ungraded students taking *any* assessment must take the assessment appropriate for their age based on date of birth

Special Circumstances

- Be sure to enroll students placed at BOCES
- Most BOCES students take ELA, Math and Science on CBT
- Remember to enroll students placed at other out of district facilities
- It is the district's responsibility to get the answer sheets to these OOD locations, have them scored, and return the sheets for scanning
- ELL students even NYSAA Eligible ones take the NYSESLAT-check the date of birth chart to be sure testing as correct level
- Coordinate with BOCES to be sure your special ed students who are also ELL are correctly reported
